## **Articulation Agreement**

This agreement confirms the transferability of courses in the

Associate of Arts in Teaching (AAT)

degree programs awarded by Paris Junior College to the applicable

## Bachelor of Arts or Science Teacher Certification Degree Programs

at Texas A&M University-Commerce. This agreement becomes effective upon the date of receipt of the signatures requested below, and shall apply for students transferring from Paris Junior College to Texas A&M University-Commerce beginning Fall 2006 Semester. This articulation agreement shall remain effective until terminated via execution of a written request by either party. Said termination date will be effective at the end of the next long term semester following the date of the notice of termination.

## **SECTION 1**

## **Core Curriculum Component for all AAT Curricula**

If a student successfully completes the core curriculum at Paris Junior College, that block of courses will be transferred to Texas A&M University-Commerce and will be substituted for the core curriculum requirements at Texas A&M University-Commerce either by the award of equivalent course credit or by degree plan substitution. A student shall receive academic credit for each of the courses transferred and will not be required to take additional core curriculum courses at Texas A&M University-Commerce unless the Texas A&M University-Commerce core is a larger core curriculum than at Paris Junior College. The Core Curriculum Chart below is for informational purposes and does not preclude, as stated above, the substitution of non-equivalent core courses taught at the Paris Junior College to core curriculum at Texas A&M University-Commerce.
